Exercise 7.1. Show that if all item sizes are of the form $a_i = k \cdot 2^{-b_i}$ for some $b_i \in \mathbb{N}$, $i = 1, \dots, n$ and some fixed $k \in \mathbb{N}$ then the FIRST FIT DECREASING algorithm always finds an optimum solution.

Exercise 7.2. Give an algorithm for BIN PACKING restricted to instances with a constant number of different item sizes whose running time is polynomially bounded in the number n of items.

Hint: Use dynamic programming.

Exercise 7.3.

- (i) Prove that for any fixed $\varepsilon > 0$ there exists a polynomial-time algorithm which for any instance $I = (a_1, \dots, a_n)$ of the BIN PACKING problem finds a packing using the optimum number of bins but possibly violating the capacity constraints by ε , i. e. an $f : \{1, \dots, n\} \rightarrow \{1, \dots, \text{OPT}(I)\}$ with $\sum_{f(i)=j} a_i \leq 1 + \varepsilon$ for all $j \in \{1, \dots, \text{OPT}(I)\}$.

Hint: Use Exercise 7.2.

- (ii) Use (i) to show that the MULTIPROCESSOR SCHEDULING PROBLEM (see Exercise 6.3) has an approximation scheme.
